### Mr D's Notes:

- 1. Blanket exercise for March 7th canceled
- 2. Family Math Night Box Cars and One Eyed Jacks
  - a. Thinking it would be helpful to have as a pro-active way to highlight Math at the beginning of the school year
    - Didn't want to conflict with Meet the Staff BBQ, etc., also working with Box Cars and One Eyed Jacks' availability
  - b. Booked for Wednesday, October 3 (early out day)
    - i. Oct 2<sup>nd</sup> they're at Ardrossan.
    - ii. Oct 5 = PD day, start of long weekend; not ideal day
  - c. Is the Oct 3 date the best option?
  - d. Would you prefer the evening to be for families or parents?
- 3. Question from Grade 1s
  - a. Could P/S/T interviews for grade 1 be student led next year?
    - i. Reason: first round in November students want to show parents around the classroom, what they're working on, routines, etc.

- ii. There are no surprises if a difficult conversation needed to happen, it would have happened by this time already
- b. Various combinations/possibilities also:
  - i. Could also have 1 night "traditional" and 1 night "student led"
  - ii. Could also have November as student led and March as traditional

### 4. Fees

- a. March/April we are to consult with School Council on proposed fees; mid-April must submit proposed fees to Finance
- b. Some increases for next year are allowable
- c. Agenda will have pre-printed (purchased) agendas again
  - i. Cost estimate is likely between \$6 and \$7
  - ii. Will have a pouch and a theme but not a big insert (to keep costs down)
- d. Noon hour supervision currently \$6500 in arrears/unpaid
- e. Activity (field trip fees) current classes' arrears/unpaid range between \$486 \$918
  - i. Looking at keeping activity/field trip fees the same:
    - 1. \$85 for Kindergarten
    - 2. \$60 for grades 1 6
  - ii. Exception: ski trip fees we are allowed to increase this for cost recovery
- f. Charging fees in Acorn
  - i. Suggestion from EIPS
  - ii. Have one fee for year, bug can activate partial fees for field trips as they come up
- g. Noon hour looking at 5% increase

- i. Meeting with EIPS Finance in March to work on more details for noon supervision fees
- ii. If we don't need to increase fees we won't
- h. Deficits need to be covered by school operating budget or SGF unrestricted funds (e.g. recycling money)

# Suggestion for Schools – Elementary Example

- Submit a blanket amount for a grade or course
- When setting fees in Acorn, itemize per activity
  - · Each fee can be paid individually or in full
  - · Allows parents to choose which activity the student will take part in
  - Enables the school to determine whether an activity is feasible based on participation

	only get 71% of per student grants from the education budget, elementary and high school students get 78%. Big concern about political change that may significantly the budget if government changes. Another concern is that High School has already lost a lot of funding through High School redesign. Additional concern did not want to take dollars away from elementary schools where foundational learning occurs.	

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	Question is what is the problem that we are seeing at the Junior High level that needs the extra funding. Most Junior Highs have surplus already so they are functioning well on what they are given. Reviewed options offered to students to ensure that there was no decrease in variety offered. Options have actually been increased. As well there are other funds schools can access if issues arise, even throughout the year.
